Bergstrom-Mahler Museum of Glass Opens Unique Study Gallery

Subsequent to a significant gift to the BMMOG by Gary and Marge McClanahan, the Mabel R. McClanahan Memorial Study Gallery was opened in honor of Gary's mother who passed away in 2012. The space is devoted to paperweights and includes a 20-foot table housing 14 individual light boxes displaying paperweights. The opening featured a Rick Ayotte exhibit and a gift from Gordon Park to the museum of 125 works in memory of Leo and Ruth Kaplan: *The Artistry of Rick Ayotte: Selections from the Collection of Gordon Park*. Gordon Park, VP of PCA, Inc. has followed the career of Rick Ayotte over the years and owns a tremendous Ayotte collection.

Also of note: September 13, 2014 – February 15, 2015 The BMMOG will present *Beauty Beyond Nature: The Art of Paul Joseph Stankard.* The exhibit will feature 70 exquisite glass pieces spanning the illustrious and influential career of the artist.

Photojournalism Project 'Collectors and Their Collections'

Earlier in the year, we were visited by a Photojournalism student of Loyalist College in Belleville, Ontario. Her interest was to do a photo workup as part of a project on 'Collectors and Their Collections'. She found us by Googling 'collectors' and located our website.

I must say that her workup required a significant amount of effort. Her intention was to photograph me surrounded by our collection. We spent the afternoon emptying our cabinets of weights so that I could then sit for an extended period of time on our living room carpet while she placed paperweights in large circles all around me. Then she mounted a stepladder with an impressive camera and lighting equipment to take enough shots to satisfy her professor. At the end of the session, all those weights had to be returned to their cabinets while I worked out the kinks in my legs. I gave her a small modern paperweight as a souvenir. Hopefully she received stellar marks from her professor!

Southern Ontario Auction with Glass Paperweights

Tracy and I normally browse the web looking for local auctions in Southern Ontario which have glass paperweights.

Usually, the online descriptions and photos for most of these auctions do not reference or show any glass paperweights. Once in a while, we see some poor resolution photos which show glass paperweights that might be of interest. However, when we go to look at the weights, 99% of the time none are of interest and we leave empty-handed without even waiting for the auction to begin.

However, last March, there was a four-day local online auction – no live or telephone bidding – which had six glass paperweights. And the photos were of a high enough quality to identify them.

One was an antique Clichy scramble, one was an Arculus/Walsh-Walsh with a fake 1848 date, two were by Paul Ysart, one was a Murano fruit weight, and one was a Pinchbeck. We were especially interested in the two Paul Ysart weights – a millefiori butterfly and a patterned millefiori. We went to see the weights at an auction preview.





The Clichy scramble, Arculus/Walsh-Walsh with the fake 1848 date, and two Paul Ysart's were all in very good to excellent condition. The Murano fruit weight had an imperfection (from the making or perhaps from damage). The Pinchbeck had two dings on the top.

We decided to bid on the Clichy and the two Paul Ysart's but not until nearly the end of the four-day auction. We watched in the interim. Bidding was quite active for the Clichy, the Arculus/Walsh-Walsh, and the Murano paperweight. For the Ysart's, only one person had bid the starting amount of CA\$80 but there were no subsequent bids. No one had placed a bid on the damaged Pinchbeck.

With about 10 minutes remaining in the auction – the auction conditions stated that if anyone bid with less than 5 minutes to go the auction would be extended by 5 minutes for as many times as required until there were no more bids – we entered our maximum bids for the Clichy and the two Paul Ysart weights. The bidding on the Clichy soon exceeded our bid. However, we were now the high bidders on the two Paul Ysart weights at CA\$90.

While the auction was local, it was advertised online on the LiveAuctioneers site so people around the world could see the weights and bid on them.

We anxiously watched the auction for the remaining 9 minutes or so thinking that someone would surely bid on the Paul Ysart's but no one did!

We are thrilled to be able to add these two weights to our collection – especially for the low price even with the 20% buyer's premium and the 13% HST tax.

We will be continuing to search for local auctions with glass paperweights – hoping to find some more treasures to add to our collection.

Protecting Your Paperweight Collection

Over the years, members have been urged to take the time to properly document their collections. A future newsletter will include a reminder of the important information to include. Today, we wish to remind you to take steps to protect the paperweights you have.

A PCA Texas member had experienced the destruction of two-thirds of her collection when the glass shelves in her display case collapsed. She urged everyone to be cautious when moving cases. In a somewhat similar incident, one of our own members experienced damage when a glass shelf collapsed. However, in this incident, the reason for the collapse of the shelf was due to fatigue over time of the plastic clips supporting the glass. It is suggested that you periodically check the supporting clips and consider switching to the metal type.


